



Call for Article Submissions – Ivy Enber Scientific Journal – 2026

Launched in 2021, the Ivy Enber Scientific Journal (IESJ) is a periodic scientific publication affiliated with Ivy Enber Christian University, with the purpose of promoting and disseminating academic production in the fields of Humanities, Health Sciences, and Applied Social Sciences. The journal welcomes contributions from Brazilian and international authors, prioritizing studies that critically engage with the aforementioned thematic fields, in accordance with the principles of interdisciplinarity, scientific innovation, and social commitment.

With ISSN 2833-227X, the Ivy Enber Scientific Journal invites researchers, academics, and professionals to submit original and unpublished articles for its regular issues. This call aims to present the editorial guidelines, evaluation criteria, and thematic areas of interest, as well as the necessary procedures for manuscript submission.

In the field of Humanities, the IESJ encourages the publication of studies in the areas of Philosophy, History, Geography, Anthropology, Psychology, Education, Arts, Theology, Linguistics, and Literature, contributing to the critical analysis of the human condition, cultures, subjectivities, and forms of sociability.

In the field of Health Sciences, the journal welcomes papers addressing topics related to public health, collective health, epidemiology, health policies, integrative practices, bioethics, health promotion, mental health, preventive medicine, nursing, nutrition, physiotherapy, among other approaches related to well-being and quality of life in different contexts and populations.

In Applied Social Sciences, the IESJ prioritizes contributions in the areas of Social Work, Law, Administration, Economics, Accounting Sciences, Communication, Public Management, Social Policies, and Urban Planning, with special attention to analyses focused on combating social inequalities, promoting human rights, sustainable development, and innovation in social and institutional practices.

The journal accepts manuscripts written in Portuguese, English, or Spanish. Regardless of the main language of the article, the submission of the title, abstract, and keywords in all three languages is mandatory, aiming to expand the visibility and international reach of the published scientific production.

1. Objective

The Ivy Enber Scientific Journal (IESJ) aims to disseminate scientific knowledge and promote academic debate in the fields of Education Sciences, Administration Sciences, Health Sciences, Legal Sciences, and Theology.

The journal is committed to publishing high-quality research that contributes to the advancement of knowledge and practices in their respective fields.

2. Thematic Areas



Articles addressing, but not limited to, the following thematic areas will be accepted:

Education Sciences

This field encompasses theoretical and empirical investigations aimed at understanding and improving educational processes at different levels and modalities of education, with special focus on Basic Education. Studies analyzing the following topics are welcome:

- Basic Education Policies, with emphasis on public educational policies, education funding, educational governance, planning and management of school systems, literacy programs, institutional evaluation, and curricular reforms;
- Educational Inclusion in Basic Education, addressing topics such as special education, inclusive education, equity of access and permanence, ethnic-racial diversity, gender and sexuality, youth and adult education, rural populations, Indigenous peoples, and Quilombola communities;
- Methodologies and Practices in Basic Education, focusing on active methodologies, hybrid learning, digital technologies in education, innovative pedagogical practices, teacher training, learning assessment, didactics, classroom management, and teaching-learning processes mediated by different languages and sociocultural contexts.

Administration Sciences

This area invites the submission of studies investigating management practices, theories, and processes in public, private, and third-sector organizations, with a contemporary, sustainable, and innovative approach. Topics include:

- Strategy and Innovation, focusing on business models, organizational innovation, digital transformation, entrepreneurship, competitive intelligence, strategic planning, and scenario analysis;
- Marketing and Consumer Sciences, encompassing consumer behavior, social marketing, digital marketing, branding, organizational communication, and market analysis;
- Finance and Sustainability, covering corporate finance, investments, managerial accounting, socio-environmental responsibility, ESG (Environmental, Social and Governance), performance indicators, and green economy;
- Organizations and People, including human resource management, organizational culture, leadership, diversity in organizations, health and well-being at work, organizational learning, conflict mediation, and corporate governance.

Health Sciences

The field of health is addressed in its epistemological, practical, and institutional plurality.



The Ivy Enber Scientific Journal welcomes contributions analyzing:

- Management of Health Organizations, Technology, and Innovation, focusing on hospital management models, health policies, health governance, technologies applied to healthcare and management, digital health, and artificial intelligence applied to healthcare;
- Therapeutic Assessment and Intervention in Clinical Practice, encompassing interdisciplinary approaches in the fields of physiotherapy, psychology, occupational therapy, speech therapy, nutrition, and other clinical sciences, with emphasis on therapeutic effectiveness, intervention protocols, and clinical innovation;
- Spirituality and Health, including studies on spirituality and religiosity as dimensions of comprehensive healthcare, integrative and complementary practices, and relationships between faith, well-being, and mental health;
- Public Health and Environment, focusing on social determinants of health, health surveillance, environmental health, public sanitation policies, collective health, health promotion, and health inequalities.

Legal Sciences

This field welcomes works discussing the relationship between Law and contemporary social challenges, prioritizing critical, interdisciplinary, and comparative analyses. The following focuses stand out:

- Human Rights, including topics related to social justice, equality, the right to education, health, environment, diversity, international protection systems, social minorities, and vulnerable populations;
- Business Law and Market, emphasizing contracts, compliance, intellectual property, corporate law, consumer relations, arbitration, and business conflict resolution;
- Law, Technology, and Innovation, addressing digital regulation, data protection, artificial intelligence, cybercrime, bioethics, blockchain, and the legal impacts of emerging technologies;
- Law Applied to Business and Public Management, covering topics such as administrative law, public procurement and contracts, accountability and transparency, tax law, public governance, and State civil liability.

Theology

Theology is considered a field of dialogue between faith, knowledge, and society, promoting theoretical, historical, pastoral, and interdisciplinary studies. Contributions addressing the following topics are encouraged:

- Theological Field, Culture, and Society, including systematic theology, practical theology, public theology, hermeneutics, biblical studies, spirituality, theological ethics, interreligious dialogue, popular religiosity, religiosity and culture, religion and politics,



theological education, and the role of religious traditions in building just, supportive, and sustainable societies.

3. Types of Contributions

The Ivy Enber Scientific Journal (IESJ) accepts the following categories of submissions:

- **Original Research Articles:** papers presenting original and relevant research findings. From 15 to 25 pages.
- **Literature Reviews:** critical and comprehensive analyses of the literature on a specific topic. From 15 to 25 pages.
- **Case Studies:** detailed descriptions of specific cases with practical and theoretical implications. From 15 to 25 pages.
- **Critical Review Articles:** in-depth discussions on emerging and controversial topics in the field of study. From 15 to 25 pages.
- **Experience Reports:** detailed reports of innovative practices and interventions in specific contexts. From 15 to 25 pages.
- **Theoretical Essays:** contributions exploring and developing new theories and concepts. From 15 to 25 pages.
- **Book Reviews:** books published within a maximum period of one year. From 3 to 5 pages.
- **Extended Abstracts:** from 8 to 10 pages.

4. Submission Criteria

Manuscripts must meet the following criteria:

- Be original and not previously submitted for publication in another journal. The student must submit a Declaration of Absence of Self-Plagiarism.
- Be written in Portuguese, English, or Spanish.
- Follow the journal's formatting guidelines, available on the website Ivy Enber Scientific Journal Submission Guidelines: <https://enberuniversity.com/revista/index.php/ies/about/submissions>
- Include title (up to 20 words), abstract (up to 250 words), and keywords (up to 5) in Portuguese, English, or Spanish.
- Present an updated and relevant literature review.
- Be structured into clear sections: introduction, theoretical framework, methodology, results, discussion, and conclusions.



- Include bibliographic references according to ABNT or APA standards.
- Ensure that all research data and methodologies are clearly described to enable study replication.
- Papers may include up to five authors, consisting of one main author and up to four co-authors.
- Each main author may submit up to two articles per year and participate as co-author in up to three articles per year.
- We encourage and support publications by students in partnership with their academic advisors.

5. Submission Process

Authors must submit their manuscripts through the electronic system available on the journal's website: Ivy Enber Scientific Journal Submission System <https://enberuniversity.com/revista/index.php/ies/login>, following the steps below:

- Registration in the system.
- Completion of manuscript information, including title, abstract, keywords, and thematic area.
- Upload of the main file (without author identification) and supplementary documents:
 - authors' identification;
 - declaration of originality;
 - declaration of conflicts of interest;
 - research ethics committee approval (when involving human beings or animals);
 - plagiarism detection report (issued by a tool chosen by the author), in accordance with Ordinance No. 4 of 2025 of the Academic Council of Ivy Enber Christian University;
 - similarity or AI detection report (also issued by a tool chosen by the author), in accordance with Ordinance No. 4 of 2025 of the Academic Council of Ivy Enber Christian University.
- The author must make the payment of R\$ 299.00 (non-students) and R\$ 249.00 (students) per submission, which must be processed through Enber's financial department.

6. Evaluation Process



Submitted articles will be evaluated through a double-blind peer review process, ensuring impartiality and publication quality. The evaluation process includes the following stages:

- Verification of compliance with the journal's guidelines.
- Initial evaluation by the editorial board.
- Submission for review by at least two expert reviewers in the thematic area.
- Receipt and analysis of reviewers' reports by the editors.
- Editorial decision based on the received reviews, which may include: acceptance, acceptance with modifications, revision and resubmission, or rejection.
- Communication of the editorial decision to the authors.

7. Important Deadlines

The Ivy Enber Scientific Journal (IESJ) informs that the submission of scientific articles is subject to a rigorous peer-review process, ensuring academic rigor, originality, and relevance of the received contributions.

The editorial team emphasizes that the submission of manuscripts does not imply an automatic commitment to publication, nor does it guarantee inclusion in specific journal issues. Each submitted article will be analyzed according to the current editorial policy, compatibility with the journal's thematic areas, the quality of the content, and compliance with the established technical standards.

Additionally, it is clarified that the journal does not commit to immediate publication or publication within periods shorter than 30 (thirty) days from the submission date. The time required for editorial processing — including initial screening, referral for evaluation by ad hoc reviewers, possible requests for revisions, and final deliberation by the editorial board — may vary according to the submission flow and the complexity of the analyzed topics.

The IESJ values academic integrity, transparency in editorial processes, and commitment to scientific quality, thereby preserving the credibility of the publication and respect for international best practices in scientific publishing.

8. Formatting Guidelines

Manuscripts must follow the journal's formatting guidelines, which include:

- Main text: Times New Roman font, size 12, 1.5 line spacing.
- Abstract: Times New Roman font, size 10, single spacing.
- Margins of 2.5 cm on all sides.



- Page numbering in the lower right corner.
- Tables and figures must be inserted within the text body and also submitted as separate files, in accordance with ABNT or APA standards.
- Citations and references must follow ABNT or APA standards.

9. Ethics and Integrity Policy

The Ivy Enber Scientific Journal (IESJ) adheres to the highest standards of ethics and integrity in research. Authors are expected to follow established ethical guidelines, including:

- Declaration of conflicts of interest.
- Declaration of Absence of Self-Plagiarism.
- Obtaining approval from a research ethics committee when required for studies involving human beings or animals.
- Plagiarism detection report, issued by a tool chosen by the author, in accordance with Ordinance No. 4 of 2025 of the Academic Council of Ivy Enber Christian University.
- Similarity or AI detection report (also issued by a tool chosen by the author), in accordance with Ordinance No. 4 of 2025 of the Academic Council of Ivy Enber Christian University.
- Transparency in data collection and analysis.
- Full acknowledgment of sources and collaborations.

Submissions presenting indications of artificial intelligence-generated content and/or plagiarism exceeding 20% (twenty percent), as verified through a similarity report or a specific adopted tool, will not be accepted.

10. Commitment of Authors

Submit original texts in which all authors are duly informed, referenced, and registered on the journal's platform. The author assumes responsibility for the submitted text. Passages without proper citation and reference indication will be classified as plagiarism, including those authored by the same author of the manuscript (self-plagiarism). All sources of information must be explicitly indicated in the text, including image sources of all types (whose authorship must also be identified) and links. By submitting a text for evaluation, the authors guarantee that there are no conflicts of interest regarding the publication of the manuscript. If the manuscript results from funded research, the type of support and the funding institution must be explicitly stated.

The same manuscript may not be submitted simultaneously for evaluation to the Ivy Enber



Scientific Journal and to other publications. After its exclusive submission to the Editorial Board, authors must await either publication or explicit rejection, the latter allowing new submissions to other journals. Upon publication of the text, the authors commit to promoting the dissemination of the issue, as well as updating the publication in their academic résumés (especially Lattes and ORCID), among other author indexing networks and databases (such as Google Scholar, ResearchGate, Academia.edu, etc.), linking it to the journal.

11. Ethical Commitments

The Ivy Enber Scientific Journal (IESJ) follows the codes of ethics, best practices, and transparency guidelines established by the Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE), in order to maintain the originality and quality of published works and safeguard the community of authors, reviewers, and editors that compose it.

In cases of suspected ethical misconduct, contact with the journal may be made through the email . Complaints will be duly registered and investigated by the Editorial Board, which will proceed in accordance with the ethical conduct procedures indicated by the Committee on Publication Ethics, including a response to the complainant and, when applicable, content retraction.

Authors, editors, reviewers, proofreaders, and readers hold ethical responsibilities and commitments relevant to their roles within the journal.

12. Final Considerations

Authors of accepted articles authorize the Ivy Enber Scientific Journal (IESJ) to publish and distribute their works while preserving copyright ownership. The submission of an article implies agreement with the journal's rules and policies.
